What's a QR code, anyway?



A QR code (an initialism for quick response code) is a essentially a visual shortcut, that allows an optical reader system (like your phone) to process and execute a specific command.

In our use, it's going to be pointing a web browser to a specific URL (web address).

Like your MK website, or maybe a specific document you have online somewhere.

The creation of such a complex thing is made easy by using any number of online QR code generators.

Most are free but some have a "Pro" option if you were going to be producing hundreds and wanted to track them using that site's database analysis tools.



Best of all, it's easy to use.


You will need to create an account, and log in.

Sign in to your Flowcode account



Once in, you'll select Create, then Flowcode.




Create a new Flowcode

I want my Flowcode to look like:








There are several fomats to choose from.

Select .PNG

This is the easiest to use, and can be used just about anywhere in any app.

Using your image or document creation program, insert, drag or paste the PNG, then scale or position as needed.

Don't go too small though.

What you do is IMPORTANT! Thanks for everything! This gift is a small token of my admiration, please enjoy it. thanks again. Dedra To see more Mary Kay products and shop with me, follow this code to explore my site.

When users scan it, a small link pops up, they'll click that, and the code will open a browser to display your web site.

All they need to do is use the camera on their smartphone and point it at the code.

There is no special app they need!

This works great in signs that you might have at a public event, a card that you hand out, basically anywhere, where you want to quickly share your web site address without them (or you) needing to type it in or memorize it.
